Background:

The Abrams River School house structure has been in existence since the 1840's. After it ceased to become a schoolhouse, there was interest in its' preservation, and a society was formed. In 1991 the building became a Municipal heritage property. The building has since been condemned, and the society disbanded. In November of 2018 a new society was formed, and they are interested in fixing this Heritage Property (schoolhouse) for community use.

Attachments/Additional Information:

The Abrams River School house will be applying for the Municipality's Capital Grant funding of \$15,000, however the criteria in our Capital Grant funding application guideline stipulates that the organization must have been in existence for at least 5 years; which they are not. This new society is less than six months old.

Without intervention from Council, this application will be denied by staff using the criteria.

Budget and Cost Considerations:

\$15,000 Community Hall Capital Project Grant Funding

CAO's Recommendation:

Override 'Organizations Eligible for Funding' criterion that states, 'The applicant must be a not-for-profit community hall legally registered (and in good standing), for a minimum of 5 years, under the Societies Act of Nova Scotia'.

Otherwise would not recommend such a change, but since all other community halls have received funding under this program, the lack of eligibility criteria is secondary in importance. If Council is satisfied that the community is recommitted to this property, I would recommend that criteria be waived.

Suggested Motions:

Staff requires a motion from council to waive 5-year eligibility criteria in order to have application from Abrams River School House awarded.
